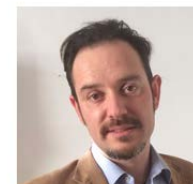
Lessons from Edinburgh: Funding a 1.4MW Solar PV portfolio across 24 Local Government sites with community shares

With a capacity of over 1.4MWp installed on 24 Local Authority roofs, it is the largest community-owned PV project of its kind in the UK. This innovative project was conceived, developed, funded, installed and is now being operated by a local Community Benefit Society with support from Energy4All. Members receive a return on investment and all profits are used to deliver education on sustainability and help reduce carbon emissions in the city. The presentation will look at the project's community share offer financing, legal structure and the approach taken with City of Edinburgh Council.

Like the previous projects, PV Financing aims to successfully remove barriers and identify new avenues for the photovoltaic market development.

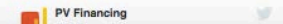
More specifically, the goal of PV FINANCING is to identify, in all the covered countries, the most profitable business models and financing schemes for PV Systems.

The project covers six European countries (Germany, France, Great Britain, Italy, Austria, Spain) and Turkey. Private investors and decision makers in banks and insurance companies will be introduced to the new business models, allowing them to include these results in their decision process as regards new investments. The project will also assess what political framework for the application of new financing models is required and which barriers slow the PV expansion.
